

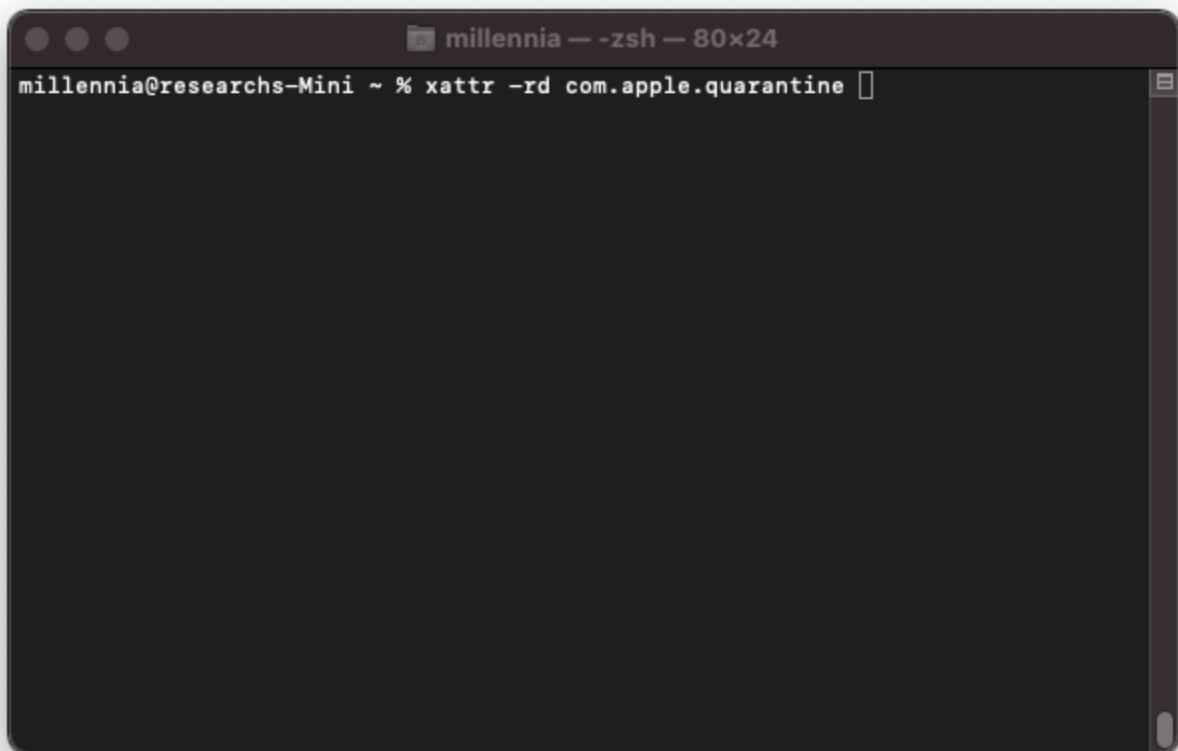
NOTE: This version of AELogic is for M1-based Macs. If you are using an Intel-based Mac, please contact Millennia Media for the Intel version.

To install AELogic to your Mac, move the AELogic application to your Applications folder.


When first downloaded, AELogic will be quarantined by MacOS. Removing the quarantine flag requires the terminal, but luckily it only requires a single command.

Start the Terminal application. (Can be found under /Applications/Utilities)

Type into the terminal: "xattr -rd com.apple.quarantine " (note the space at the end)



Then drag and drop the AELogic.app application onto the terminal. The location of the application will appear in the terminal.

Then press enter to run the command.

There will be several “file does not exist” errors that appear, but this is fine. After running the command, you should be able to run AELogic.

This application requires Rosetta 2 to run on Apple Silicon devices. If you are on Apple Silicon and do not have Rosetta 2 installed, the application will prompt you and install Rosetta 2 before running.
